INTRODUCTION

The 2014 Allen Trial will once again start and finish at The Bull Inn at Hinton, just off the A46 approximately 2 miles south of Junction 18 on the M4. The event will of course include all the old favourites (Uplands, Guys Hill, Travers & John Walker)

Once again we are running the trial under a Dual-Permit. (National B & Clubman) The Clubman Event (open to invited clubs) allows non-championship contender to participate in the trial without the need for a competition licence.

We will be using the same trailer parking as last year. In order to assist us in determining the amount of trailer parking required we are asking competitors to indicate on their entry form if they require a trailer space, your cooperation in this will be much appreciated.

In recent years the trial has been well subscribed so to avoid disappointment don't delay with your entry. If you are unable to enter but could come and marshal we would be delighted to hear from you.

1. **The Event** - The Bristol Motor Club will organise a Dual Permit Nat B/Clubmans Classic Reliability Road Trial on Sunday 30th November 2014.
The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd.,(incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting code of the FIA), and the Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.
2. MSA Permit Numbers Nat B. 85585 Clubmans: 85586
DOE Route Authorisation No: 27178NO30
3. **Championships** - The event is a round of the 2014 ACTC Trials Championship.
2014 REIS ASWMC Classic Reliability Trials Championship
Championship Registration No 25/2014
Only competitors in the Nat-B event may score championship points.
4. **Eligibility** - The NAT B event is open to:
fully elected members of the organising club.
All fully elected members of Clubs associated with the ACTC and ASWMC
The Clubmans event is open to:
All fully elected members of the organising Club
All fully elected members of the following invited clubs:MCC, Stroud & District Motor Club .Bristol Pegasus Motor Club & V S C C.
Competitors / drivers in the National B Event must produce a valid Competition Licence, Club Membership Card and MOT Certificate, if required for their car.
Competitors in the Clubman Event just need a valid Club Membership Card and MOT Certificate.
5. Passengers in the Nat B event must produce a membership card from one of the invited Clubs or an ACTC Life Passenger Membership Card. These can be bought for £1 at signing on.
6. **The Start** is at the BULL INN in HINTON Map 172 MR 735768. 2 miles south of junction 18 on the M4. Scrutineering will start at 7.15am in trailer field.
Individual starting times will be advised in the final instructions and any competitor not signed on 30 minutes before their start time may be excluded. First Car will start at 8.15am and the cars will leave at one minute intervals thereafter ,breaks may be introduced to avoid delays.
No time schedule will apply during the Event . **The finish** will also be at the BULL INN” where Competitors must sign off to collect a Finisher’s Certificate.
7. **The Route** – Both Nat-B and Clubmans will follow the same route Public roads will be used to link Sections. The route is approximately 75 miles and will contain about 12 Observed Sections and 2 Special Tests. The whole route is on O.S. MAP 172 Landranger Series. Route checks may be operated during the event and competitors failing to follow the correct route may be excluded.
8. **Class Structure** - The event will consist of 8 classes as follows:
 1. Front engine, front wheel drive production cars (except vehicles in class 6).
 2. “Production Cars” originally manufactured prior to 1941, and the following: MG TC, Morgan 4-4 Series 1, HRG 1100 and 1500, Ford models (upright to 1959.)E04A, E494A, E4930A/B, E93A, E493A and 103E.
 3. Front engine, rear wheel drive production saloons, (except vehicles in class 6)
 4. Rear engine, rear wheel drive production saloons up to and incl. 1300cc (except cars in class 7)
 5. a) Front engine production sports cars (except vehicles in classes 1 & 6)
b) Vehicles built from pre 1941 components (except vehicles in Class 2).
 6. a) Rear engine, rear wheel drive production cars (except vehicles in class 4)
b) Front engine production cars fitted with torque biasing differential as **standard** equipment.
 7. a) Production cars modified beyond permitted limits
b) Rear engine production cars fitted with torque biasing differential as **standard** equipment.
c) Front engine cars manufactured on a limited basis as defined in ACTC Rule 4.2.2.
conforming to accepted specification and listed,
these cars must also comply with either or both of the following:
i) Have the rearmost part of the front seat cushion(s) forward of any part of the rear tyres.
ii) Have a wheelbase of 90 inches or greater.
 8. a) Non-Production cars
b) Rear engine cars (except vehicles in Classes 4, 6 & 7)
c) Front engine cars manufactured on a limited basis (except those in class 7) including those which
i) Have the rearmost part of the front seat rearward of the rear tyres and
ii) Have a wheelbase of less than 90 inches.

All references to classes in T10 shall be interpreted as referring to the above class structure.
N.B. M.C.C. reclassification certificates are not valid for this event.

9. **Mandatory Requirements - All vehicles** must comply with MSA Technical Regulations for Classic Reliability Trials including MOT Certificate (where applicable) , have valid V.E.D.(car tax)and be covered by Insurance valid for use on the public highway.

All tyres including spares must comply with the ACTC tyre list & MSA regulation T10.9-11 (off road tyres will not be permitted)

Fire Extinguisher – all vehicles are required to carry a MSA approved fire extinguisher. The minimum quantity being 1.75 litres of AFFF. Ref K3.1.1.

Spill Kit – all vehicles are required to carry a small spill kit as per MSA regulation.

Noise -- All cars must be fitted with an **effective silencer**. Any cars found to be too noisy by the Scrutineer will not be allowed to start. Noise checks will be in operation during the event, with Officials being empowered to exclude cars, or request remedial action to reduce noise levels.

If in the opinion of the Organisers the appearance and or condition of a vehicle does not meet an acceptable standard it will not be permitted to start, and if started will be excluded.

10. **Awards** will be presented as follows:

Class Awards are subject to:

- Class minimum of 3 entries for First in Class Award
- Class minimum of 6 entries for Second in Class Award
- Class minimum of 9 entries for Third in Class Award

A certificate will be awarded to each Competitor and Navigator signing off as a Finisher.

No Competitor may win more than one Award, except winner of JFH Trophy.

Actual Marks lost will determine Awards (not Index of Performance)

Awards will be presented at the Bristol MC Annual Prize Giving in February 2015.

The Trophies are to be held for 11 months or less should the organisers require them, but Souvenir Awards for retention will be made to Trophy Winners

- 11 **Entries** - The Entry List opens on publication of these SR's and closes finally on 17/11/14.

All entries must be made on the official Entry Form and accompanied by the appropriate of **£ 33.00** for both National B and the Clubman Events.

The maximum entry for the meeting including reserves is 75, the minimum is 25.

The minimum for each class is 3 and maximum is 20 unless total entry fails to reach 75.

Should any of the above figures not be reached, the Organisers have the right to either cancel them event or amalgamate Classes as necessary.

Entries will be selected on a first come first served basis. Entry fees may be refunded at the discretion of the Secretary of the Meeting.

Entries will not be acknowledged before posting Final Instructions, unless a self addressed envelope is sent or an Email address is added to the Entry Form.

14. **Results** - Provisional Results will be published & posted within 7 days of the event.
15. **Protests** -Any protest must be lodged in accordance **with C.5.** accompanied by the appropriate Fee.
16. **Numbers** - All vehicles will carry numbers supplied by the Organisers at the start of the event and class identification coloured disc. Numbers should be mounted vertically, one facing forward, one facing rearwards, and are to be removed on completion of the Event or in the event of retirement. It is the competitors responsibility to ensure that these numbers remain legible at all times. Competitors need to provide and fix a number (motor cycle number plate size) corresponding with their class to the centre of their class disc. These numbers are available from car accessory shops or factors.
17. **Marking and Penalties** - will be as printed in the appropriate section of the MSA General Regulations T7.5 except, items: a,i,k,l,m, -which are deleted & j,n - where penalty is exclusion.
In addition - failure to complete a Special Test as specified will incur a penalty of 6 points and the time of the slowest competitor in the class who completes the test correctly, plus 10 seconds, will be scored.
- In the event of a tie, the aggregate of times on the Special Tests will determine result.
- If a tie is still unresolved the vehicle with the smallest engine capacity will be considered the winner. (Super or Turbo charged cars having their cc multiplied by the MSA formula).
- If a tie is still unresolved the times in Special Test 1 will decide.
- On Sub-divided Sections there is no penalty for hitting markers.
 - All other general regulations of the MSA applied as written.
 - Class 8 competitors should note T4.1.8 regarding seating of passengers.
 - Unless stated in route card. Competitors or passengers must not pass the start line on foot prior to starting test. Failure to comply will incur 12 penalty points.
18. Insurance must be valid for this type of event. The Club has applied to **Lockton** for a Blanket Cover Note under their scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the Event.
The basic rate for the event (before any loadings) will be £15.63
All new applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Lockton's Declaration:-
- Over 21 and held a full licence for at least 6 months
 - Not more than 1 fault accident in last 3 Years
 - No more than maximum of 6 speeding points on licence
 - No physical or mental disabilities
 - No other material facts
- IMPORTANT: All Material Facts must be Disclosed. Material Facts are those likely to influence the Acceptance or assessment of your risk. Failure to disclose Material Facts may lead to the Insurer Declaring the resultant cover to be null and void. If you are in any doubt about facts that may be considered to be material these should be disclosed for your own protection.
- If you comply with all points above - No Letter of Acceptance will be required.
- If unable to comply** with any of above points you will be required to complete the Declaration Form please contact the Secretary of the Meeting at least 21 days before the event who will send you a declaration form to complete.
19. **Miscellaneous**
- a) Any competitors overtaken by the Back marker will be deemed to have retired.
 - b) Any competitors involved in an accident must make a written report to the Secretary of the meeting either at the finish or within 7 days.
 - c) All Vehicles must be capable of having a tow rope quickly attached to the front and rear and this will be inspected by the Scrutineer.
 - d) Petrol will be available on route. First petrol Murco 5.5 miles from start after section 1.
 - e). Coffee, Tea and Breakfast sandwiches will be available at the Start.
