## 1984 CHAMPIONSHIP

### GENERAL

Since my last report on May13 only one Championship event has taken place. Although it was a brand new event organised by Holsworthy Motor Club, it was an outstanding success with 60 entrants.

The calculation of Championship points and the listing of positions in the Wheelspin and Crackington leagues has been committed to a computer, thanks to a tailor made programme designed by my son, Stephen. It only requires input of event results, in any form, to give a print out of league positions. This reduces the work load from 1/2 day to 1/2 an hour and incresses the accuracy. The computer is also able to assist event organisers in the preparation of event regulations etc. Details are given in the October edition of "FOUR WHEELS OUT".

The use of this facility enabled me to mail to all contenders, tables of league positions on September 1st 1984.

### **FINANCES**

A copy of the audited statement of the Championship accounts at June 30th is attached. The financial position is satisfactory but perhaps over-emphasised in these accounts since the purchase of replicas, the engraving of main trophies and replicas and the insurance of trophies still needs to be catered for. These costs are expected to be of the order of £200.

### AWARDS

Purchase of the 1984 replicas has been completed and arrangements made for their engraving. Details of the Award Presentation have been finalised. It will take place at 10.30 am Sunday January 13th 1985 at the Riviera Hotel, Sidmouth following the Exeter Trial (by agreement with MCC). Coffee and biscuits will be served. Tickets, price £0.75 each will be sold at the door.

## CLUB SWEATSHIRTS

Arrangements have been completed for the production and sale of our new club sweatshirts. Although everyone present at our last meeting seemed in favour of this step, sales to date have been very disappointing. Your help is needed here.

## FOUR WHEELS OUT

Our relationship with the Sporting Trials Association remains excellent. About 120 classic triallers now subscribe to this magazine. I can see no reason why our arrangement should not continue happily in the future.

The investigations into alternative printing techniques have been completed and it is hoped that Octobers edition will reflect an improvement, particularly in the photos.

## 1985 CHAMPIONSHIP

### GENERAL

Details of dates and venues were finalised at our last meeting in May and draft regulations submitted to the RAC MSA on July 12th. Formal approval was received on July 30th without difficulty. The changes made to our constitution at our last meeting as a result of RAC MSA recommendations were accepted readily without comment.

The 1985 Regulations and Entry Form were mailed to allexisting registered contenders on September 1st. Letters were also sent to all delegates, secretaries of member clubs and club magazine editors with details of 1985. At the time of writing, some 28 registrations have been accepted. Mailings to Competition Members are also now computerised.

Certain selected motoring journals are expected to publish our recent press release, so that enquiries and registrations are expected to continue. So the prospects for the future look excellent - - -thanks to the efforts of all concerned.
