ACTC Championship

Judging by the steady increase in the number of registered contenders and by the increasing number of clubs wishing to have their events included, the ACTC Series must be an outstanding success. But you may have also noticed that we have witnessed a growth in the number of class 8 cars and a reduction in the number of production saloons, sports cars and pre-1941 cars which is tending to make the sport 'top-heavy'.

This document is intended to explore ways of redressing this balance to give additional incentive to drivers in these classes and is presented to delegates in the hope that they will discuss this issue at club level and return to the next ACTC Council meeting with views on the proposals listed below.

Option 1

At present we make our annual awards as follows

Wheelspin League

The first five drivers receive trophies

Crackington League

The first five drivers who do not receive trophies in the Wheelspin League receive trophies

The suggestion would be to increase the number of trophies available in the Crackinton League so that

Wheelspin league

The first five drivers to receive trophies

Crackington League

The first ten drivers who do not receive trophies in the Wheelspin league receive trophies.

The questions you may wish to consider are whether you think this would encourage entries in the less popular classes and whether your Club would be prepared to donate/or subscribe to a suitable trophy? Perhaps you may have some variations on this theme to suggest?

Option 2

Recent changes in our points system no longer make it necessary to compete in the three long distance are the true of the secure sufficient points to win our Championships. As a consequence, it is now possible that ex-NTF cars can be much more successful. Some people think that this is not a desirable feature if we are to avoid the problems which hit trialling in the 1930's. It is suggested that we should revert to the original scoring system which called for 66% of all qualifying rounds to score and for 100% of all bonus rounds to score. This then places additional emphasis on the 'long term reliability' aspects which, you will remember, were an integral part of our original
