#### 1. Apologies for Absence

#### 2. Election of Officers.

All officers were elected at the May meeting.

#### 3. Minutes of Previous Meeting on 20th May 2012.

The minutes had been circulated with the agenda and were accepted with one exception. 21.6 should read, 'nominate Dennis for an honour'.

#### 4. Matters Arising from the May minutes.

- 4.1 Awards Presentation Dinner. It was reported this was a good enjoyable event but numbers were slightly down from previous events. Kelly Thomas is organising the 2013 event and is making progress and finding a venue.
- 4.2 Event Insurance. Simon Woodall has written a piece on this subject for 'Restart' and has posted on his ACTC web-site 'blog'.
- 4.3 Funding of the ACTC. Chris Phillips has circulated his ideas and figures to the Treasurer, Chairman and Secretary. The Treasurer's view is that the scheme would be too much of a gamble and so it has been taken no further.
- 4.4 Scrutineering Guidelines. John Blakely has produced a set of guidelines which is attached to these minutes. All club scrutineers should read these guidelines well before their event and if anything is not clear contact John for clarification. Attachment 1

John has indicated his availability for the next few months as, Exmoor Clouds, Hardy, Allen, Clee Hills and Exmoor. If clubs want to take up John's offer to act as scrutineer they must contact him.

#### 5. Financial Report.

5.1 The budget sheet for 2013 was presented, there were some typo's with dates, these will be corrected and a revised sheet is attached to these minutes. Attachment 2

#### 6. MSA Trials Committee Report

6.1 Stronger' four planet wheel differentials (based on 'free' limited slip differentials) were discussed. The rules had been changed to ensure that cars in all classes can use a 'stronger' differential as long as it is a 'free' differential. The company Tran X, which was developing the 'stronger' differential, has been acquired by Quaife and Quaife will market the 'stronger' differential.

6.2 There was discussion, for insurance purposes, to redefine the finish of Car Trials and therefore when does the permit insurance stop. This is not relevant to Classic Trials.

6.3 Discussion was also taken on the subjects of safety on Sporting Trials; the future of Historic Sporting Trials and the unsuitability of vehicles with electric handbrakes.

#### 7. Technical Matters

7.1 ACTC Differential Test Machine. The machine is now in Devon under the care of Arnie Martin, modifications and the building of a trailer are under way.

7.2 Tow Ropes and Attachments. Dudley Sterry has circulated a discussion paper. Attachment 3 On a suggestion from Stephen Bailey the internal diameter of the tow 'eye' was reduced to 30mm diameter. It was suggested that colour should be in line with MSA Rules – Red; Yellow or Orange. Will clubs please study the paper and send any comments to Dudley Sterry at dudley.sterry@zen.co.uk

7.3 Changes to Class 5b Cars. The specification has been revised and is on the ACTC web-site.
7.4 Tyres. At the last meeting it was decided to ban the Kingpin K4S tyre. Unfortunately Pete Hart our tyre expert was not at that meeting. Pete Hart then pointed out that we have approved the Michelin Taxi tyre, which is only available in 175x16 size, however the tread of the Taxi tyre is identical to the K4S tyre. It was proposed by Woolbridge MC and seconded by Launceston MC that we rescind the ban on the K4S pending further discussion. A vote of 13 to 1 for the proposition was taken but it was decided that delegates should take this matter back to their clubs for discussion and a decision will be taken at the May 2013 ACTC meeting.

#### 8. Rights of Way and LARA (Land Access & Recreation Association)

Andrew Brown had tendered his apologies. He reported that he was receiving lots of information and documentation from LARA. Information relevant to the ACTC will be posted as an adjunct to the ACTC web-site.

#### 9. Public Relations

Nothing to report.

#### 10. Restart / Web-site Report

Pat Toulmin reported that she has a new computer which at the moment is not compatible with the programme she uses to update the web-site, this is being worked on. Pat stated that some of the pictures on the ACTC web-site were rather 'tame' and asked permission to spice them up with, for example, a little tyre smoke. This was generally agreed. The printer of 'Restart' is now using new machinery to ensure that the spine is flat so excess postage will not be incurred.

The 2013 ACTC Calendar is being prepared. It is proposed to add a title to each picture, subject to consideration of the cost.

#### 11. Championship Schedule

There were minor changes to the schedule for 2012 events.

#### 12. Championship Reports

12.1 Car Championship. Chris Phillips submitted up to date championship positions and reported that currently registered were 109 car drivers, 17 motorcyclists, 17 navigators and 46 'Restart only'.

Chris Phillips has looked at the question of interleaving the awards between the Wheelspin and Crackington and done considerable work on this and suggested it should be an agenda item for May 2013.

Chris Phillips has explored the question of temporary membership and it appears that the MSA do not have any rule against it but are reported to "frown" on the idea because it dilutes club loyalty. He, Chris, remains of the view that set up correctly a pro-rata membership of, say a month, would, 1, be perfectly legal and 2, cost around £1.50 to £2.00 per event.

12.2 Motorcycle Championship. Stephen Bailey had sent his apologies and had submitted an extensive report which he had circulated to all delegates on eMail prior to the meeting. It was hoped that Stephen would be able to attend the next council meeting to expand upon his various points.

Motorcycle championship positions were available.

Post meeting note. In the latest MSA news it is stated that the MSA has been in contact with the Department of Transport and has objected to the proposed ruling in the strongest possible manner.

At the last meeting it was suggested that winners of MCC classes for cars and motorcycles should receive extra points. The view of the MCC is required.

#### 13. Championship Quality

No report available – No events have been held since the last meeting.

#### 14. Reporting of Items Discussed in the Minutes

This item had been requested by Stephen Bailey who was not present at the meeting. It is believed it mainly referred to items which had been discussed at the May 2012 meeting but not clearly indicated in the minutes.

The secretary, Stuart Harrold apologised to Stephen Bailey for not including some items discussed at the May meeting in the minutes, this was just a clerical omission.

#### 15. Any Other Business

15.1 The change in the law that will no longer require a MoT for vehicles registered pre 1960. It was stated that the driver is responsible for the road-worthiness of his vehicle. The MSA 'Blue Book' regulation T10.1 will be amended to add, 'where applicable'.

This will also be added to the requirement for a MoT in our own Scrutineering Guidelines and organisers will be required to supply year of first registration to John Blakeley in order to have the correct information on the scrutineering cards.

- 15.2 Stroud & DMC raised the topic of Wheelspin / Crackington winners. The consensus of opinion was that the onus is on individual Clerks of Course to make a trial competitive for all classes. It was noted that the ACTC used to publish a 'Guide to Organisers' a copy will be found and it will be made available to clubs.

- 15.3 Stroud & DMC raised the topic of the wording on engine regulations and this was briefly discussed, things get difficult for the smaller manufacturer such as Morgan or Reliant where they used a number of main stream manufacturers engines. Simon Woodall is drafting a paper on the overall changes to the regulations; this will be circulated to all clubs in due course. **Action: Simon Woodall**
- 15.4 Stroud & DMC would like to have a representative on the ACTC Technical Panel. It was noted that Carl Talbot had been nominated but that the panel had not met since his nomination.
- **16.0 Date of Next Meeting:** 2:00 pm, **Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> May 2013** (Note that this is different to that originally publicised) at The Major's Retreat, Tormarton. It should be noted that this will be the last meeting that Robin Moore attends as President of the ACTC.

# Scrutineering Notes

These notes are meant as a guide to club scrutineers who may not be familiar with the ACTC card system. The card should have the Running Number, Name. Registration No. and Class already printed.

The card boxes are self explanatory, subject to the following,

MOT. If a current MOT for the vehicle has been seen the expiry date

will be printed in this box or N/A if one is not required so it

will not be necessary to see it. If this box is blank please check

the MOT for the vehicle and write the EXPIRY DATE in the box

COMP NOs. Check suitable, easily viewed mounts for numbers.

CLASS DISC Check correct colour disc is on car and easily visible. On

saloons it should be centre top of windscreen. On cars with small windscreens it can be adjacent to the comp. number.

TAX DISC Check tax disc is current and for correct car.

NOISE Leave blank unless exhaust is blowing or very loud to ear.

BATTERY Should have a bar or strap over the top strong enough to hold

it in place if car overturns. Batteries fitted inside passenger area, ie. Beetles, must have battery covered to prevent acid leak in overturn. Earth terminal should be marked yellow.

TOWING HOOK Must have a facility to attach a tow line quickly and easily

without marshal having to search for it or grovel in the mud and without the driver leaving his seat, this hook must be coloured with contrasting paint to the car colour. The hook

must have a hole with a minimum bore of 30 mm diameter.

THROTTLE SPRINGS Must have a return spring on each throttle shaft visible to Scrutineer. ie not internal and not on linkage.

TOOLS Must be well fixed and unable come adrift and not carried externally.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER Must be AFFF foam type (aqueous film forming foam)

Minimum size 1.75 litres Zero 360 Gas type is permissible.

SPILL KIT A small spill kit must be carried on all competing cars.

Proprietary Mat type kits are best. With home made kits you must be sure they will absorb a minimum of 1.25 litres of fluid. Gloves and container or bag to carry used material must be included. Absorbent Granules are not encouraged as they are unpopular with Farmers. If granules are used a shovel must


be included to clear all traces after use.

TYRES Must be normal road pattern and listed on ACTC tyre list.

FAULTS FOUND Write in any new faults.

OUTSTANDING FAULTS Check any listed faults have been corrected. If not give a second warning. IF CARD SAYS A SECOND WARNING HAS ALREADY BEEN GIVEN CARD SHOULD BE WITHHELD AND COMPETITOR EXCLUDED UNTIL FIXED.

### Recovery of Vehicles from Trials Sections - Safety Considerations

Proposed Towing Attachment Specification for review by ACTC clubs.

All vehicles must have a substantial towing attachment such as an eye securely fixed to the front of the main structure of the vehicle. The eye, typically 30mm internal diameter, to be clearly visible, painted a contrasting bright colour and located high enough such that the towing hawser shackle can be easily attached by the recovery team when the vehicle is grounded in ruts or mud.

Vehicles where a suitable part of the structure such as the front axle is easily accessible e.g. Austin 7 and subject to scrutineer approval, may continue to use same as the towing attachment so long as the attachment point is clearly visible and painted a contrasting bright colour.

Where the preferred attachment point to the main structure, possibly an existing tow point, is too low and inaccessible under the front of the vehicle it is permissible to use a short flexible strap attached to the structure and with a towing eye at its end. The eye would normally be held up on the front of the vehicle but easily detachable by the recovery team to give a straight pull when used for towing. The strap to be made from a **minimum 5 tonne** braking strain webbing with appropriate fittings *ideally* professionally manufactured as a bespoke item. Being low down the strap may need additional protection from damage.

A vehicle may be excluded from starting should the scrutineer consider the towing attachment to be damaged or of inadequate strength or unsuitably location. A tow rope looped across the bonnet with a bungee to hold it up, will except under most exceptional circumstances be rejected by scrutineering, as this approach has been shown to be unreliable and potentially dangerous.

Having a secure attachment point on the competitor vehicle is only half the story. The recovery team need to be properly equipped and know what they are doing particularly so if using kinetic tow equipment. Kinetic tow ropes can make recovery a lot easier particularly when expecting a tow vehicle to start on a steep slope without too much snatch, however a kinetic rope failure would be much more serious than when a conventional rope failed.

ACTC Committee Motorcycle Championship Report. Sept. 9th 2012.

Apologies for absence, I have quite a lot going on at the moment.

I hope to be at the next Committee meeting in 2013.

1. \*I would like this part of the Motorcycle Championship report which contains other issues to be presented before Adoption of the minutes:\*

Firstly and of the most importance as far as the Committee is concerned is that which has been tabled as item 17. Reporting of items discussed in the minutes.

I sent in a lot of points which were discussed however none of those points appeared on the committee minutes.

This looks like I am not doing anything (and possibly the committee are not discussing the points raised). I sent out a mail to all the Committee members and the Motorcycle championship contenders to this point.

I received only one reply that the committee had discussed the points however were not miniuted.

I would like it to be noted that the minutes of the meeting are not a true reflection of what was discussed and that this be included together with a précis of what was discussed and some conclusions. Thank you.

I also would like a Précis of the minutes to be included in Restart Magazine. Then the Competitors would have a better understanding of what goes on.

2. \*\* Item 7.2 this Agenda.

Probably the best point to address this....

The ACTC has a ruling now that Towing eyes on vehicles should be Yellow.

There was always a suggestion that they should be a contrasting colour to the car and a yellow towing eye is not suitable on a yellow vehicle.

Also the Motorsport ruling states: Towing eyes should be either:

Red, Orange or Yellow.

I strongly suggest that these colours be adopted for the ACTC. So that they harmonise with the RAC Motorsport regulations and also the previous ACTC Suggestion.

3.\* Now the Motorcycle Championship Report.

I attended the MCC Testing Trial and the Popham Mega Meet and had a bundle of ACTC entry forms though there seemed very low uptake or interest. Possibly the cost of fuel and overnight accommodation is the main factors?

I continue to advertise the ACTC on the BEGUK, TBM and ABR Forums and this has generated some interest though the main factor there seems to be one of

persuading those with suitable machinery to join in the competitions rather than go green-laneing which is the much cheaper option.

A reasonable amount of entries is still being reported in most Trials. In fact even numbers of Motorcycles and Cars and sometimes more motorcycles are entered.

David Craddock is leading the Pouncy League with 52 points to Andrew Craddock second with 47, Third is Ian Myers on 32, Fourth Buster griffin with 31 and fifth Phillip Saunders on 27.

For the Sidecar Red Rose Bowl. Al Lidagte leads with 68 followed by Simon Eddy with 59 and third Last years winner Geoff Westcott with 39.

4\*. The last point and the most important as far as Trial are concerned.

Many are now aware of the EU agenda to Ban private vehicles in order to meet the extremely low accident rate target set and so called environmental issues. However there are many hidden agendas in this raft of impending legislation. Some of which seem to smack of corruption at a high level and many also seem the product of a sanitised and mislead euro parliament.

I am actively working with MAG (Motorcycle Action Group) to oppose this in all its forms of legislation (Stricter MOTS, Difficulty in passing tests, Difficulty in licence renewal and anti tampering laws.

In effect banning Motorcycling and Driving by making it is too expensive, complicated and difficult to actually ride or drive.

There is on the way planned legislation banning vehicles over ten years old from "Urban Areas". (This is already in place for most Diesel engined vehicles inside most of the M25. and seems to have been accepted by most without any thought or chance of appeal.)

Only replacement or modified parts from those made by the original manufacturer of the vehicle. Thus any vehicle that is not currently being made will eventually not be able to be ridden or driven.

This has started with Motorcycles as they are the minority group, however Cars are next on the EU list.

MAG have full time representatives in Brussels and liaise with the British parliament on a high and professional level.

I urge all Riders and Drivers to Join MAG and ask if the ACTC Clubs can also Join MAG as then their members will get a reduction in subscriptions.
