Paul Brooks

7.1 2021 Accounts (Attachment 1, to be finalized after Awards Evening)

7.2 Budget (Attachment 2)

Paul Brooks talked the group through the Club Finances as detailed in Attachments 1 & 2 sent with the Agenda. Current snapshot shows the Current Account with £361 and Deposit Account £16k.

There was a lower income 2021 due to 2020 carry-over of membership as a result of Covid impact, 2022 will resume normal income levels

EOY balance for 2022 predicted £14,300. JT queried why this is lower, PB replied this is mostly due to £1.5k being allocated to Under 26 Sponsorship Scheme.

There have been large increases in electronic payments and less than 10% of members have paid by cheque.

8. Motorsport UK Trials Committee Report.

Pete Hart

Pete Hart talked through the Report drawing attention to the Catalytic converters. If they are not a legal requirement for a given car to drive on the road then they are likewise not needed for Trials.

8mm Tyre Rule going to MSUK Consultation for adding to Blue Book, the 8mm measurement will be the only criteria for the tread gaps so they can be Summer or Winter tyres. The ACTC Tyre List contents are mostly compliant now obsolete expected to remain for a couple of years for overlap and to allow Competitors to use-up existing stocks. Details of any cut-off dates can be communicated once the MSUK Consultation has completed.

Sustainability is now a significant issue.

AKB suggest we should ask MSUK what the define as sustainable. SW says MSUK currently working on Sustainability Committee Guidelines – expected in the next month.

MGCC have touring run in 3 weeks, using carbon offset scheme, 180 miles, 60 cars £180. ML asked about Electric Vehicle classes, issues with cars, KS suggest ACU are supporting Elec bikes so by introducing an Elec Class (albeit bike only) would demonstrate our first step towards sustainability.

Bath MC are now Carbon Offsetting all of their events

ACTION: PH and NS to look at options for ACTC to actively support Sustainability such as

Carbon Offset or other schemes and bring a proposal to the September

meeting.

ACTION: Club Reps to highlight the importance and PR benefits of participating in

Sustainability schemes.

9. Technical Committee

Pete Hart

Now have provision for pre-war specials in Class 2, one request received so far. No further update at this stage.

10. ACTC Rules

10.1 Proposal from Minehead MC – MCC Bonus Rounds Norton Selwood

To increase the points Gold/Silver/Bronze awards on MCC events which are currently Bonus Rounds in ACTC Championship. The proposal it to increase from 5, 3 and 1 to 8, 5 and 3 points. Also given the endurance and reliability nature of these events a single point for finishing.

Clubs could benefit as MCC has a very large pool of Competitors and more may be encouraged into ACTC Championship.

A "show of hands" was carried out and 84% were in favour of taking this forward.

ACTION: DM to discuss with MCC and report back if acceptable. Clubs to take away for local decision and bring back for voting at September meeting.

It was also considered beneficial for any finisher lower than 10th in class gets 1 point for finishing.

ACTION: PH to look at incorporating within existing rules, would only need to be applied where more than 10 entries in each class.

10.2 Proposal from Motorcycle Co-ordinator – Class ID Sticker Chris Barham

After conversations with many marshals/ observers at events, it seems many have difficulties identifying the class of a bike approaching them at a section. Whether that bike is to ride through a restart or take a deviation. While the onus is always on the competitor to do the correct Class identification stickers for Bikes would help the situation. The classes affected are Class A and Class B1/B2/B3. Mainly applies to A and B3, not just for Restarts but also sometimes for deviations.

The suggestion is for example:

Class A displays a forward facing white circular disc, 75mm diameter (old tax disc size) with a black A" displayed and Class B3 displays a yellow disc with a black "3" in it.

The Group in general supported this proposal but need to clarify fixing point on bike.

ACTION: CB to finalise the proposal and bring back for vote at next meeting

10.3 **Proposal from MCC – Class S for Step-through Bikes**Dave Middleditch

The proposal is to create a new 'Class S' for step-through bikes. This would allow these bikes to compete without having to do the class B restarts as they remain fundamentally uncompetitive.

CLASS S - Step-throughs and scooters, which must comply with the following requirements:

- a) The machine must originally have been manufactured as a step-through or scooter.
- b) There must be a nominal gap between the seat and the headstock (or bodywork at the headstock) of at least 250 mm.

The Group was overwhelmingly in favour or taking this forward.

ACTION: Club Reps to take away for local decision for voting at September meeting.

ACTION: DM and CB to look at alignment of MCC/ACTC rules e.g. Classes and tyres.

11. Championship

11.1 2022 Event Calendar

SG reported that the Hardy 2022 will not be happening, hopefully the event will resume in 2023.

ACTION: KS to notify John Bell to update the entry in 2023 Calendar.

AK would like to move the Camel Heights to 5th March 2023 but was awaiting Landowner confirmation.

ACTION: AK to advise KS when confirmed so that KS can inform John Bell to update Calendar.

A vote resulting in acceptance of the 2023 Calendar is required before it can be sent to MSUK to register the Championship, this could not however be achieved at this meeting so KS will follow-up separately once the Camel Heights date has been confirmed by AK.

ACTION: KS to seek agreement from the Group via Email once these changes are confirmed.

12. Rights of Way Officer report.

The previously reported problems with access to Forestry England land appear to have been solved, at least temporarily, on a local basis, although the Master Agreement between Motorsport UK and FE is still not finalised. There has been total silence from DEFRA since the Consultation on the Landscapes Review ended on 9th April. We understand that GLASS emailed over 16,000 Parish Councils and similar bodies to counter the statements made to them in the GLEAM letter.

Norton Selwood

Good this year, pretty much every event been at capacity or over-subscribed however the Northern is struggling to reach the break-even point for this year.

DH thanked NS for social media content to keep people interested.

17. **A.O.B.**

(a) The MCC have paid for further development of TrialsAppLive and this can be made available for other Clubs to use at a cost of £1.50 per competitor. This allows direct inputting of scores by Marshalls via mobile phone and will perform all of the calculations to quickly work out the scores.

If you are interested Dave Middleditch can arrange a demo.

(b) Launceston & NC MC would like agreement from Clubs for consistent judging on Hitting Markers being a Fail or not.

This generated lots of discussion, markers not counted historically on some long-running events yet being enforced on others, however T6.4.1 says hitting markers is a penalty.

Agreement for a consistent approach could not be achieved so the Group concluded that Clubs should be allowed to apply the marker rule as they wish however noting that the default BB say hitting markers count as a failure.
